### COLONEL PROFESSOR SIR JONATHAN VAN-TAM MBE

**C**olonel Professor Sir Jonathan Van-Tam MBE is Honorary Colonel to the Army Cadet Force Medical Volunteers and 306 Hospital Support Regiment. He is a British public health physician specialising in influenza and other respiratory viruses and was at the forefront of the UK's pandemic response to Covid-19 as Deputy Chief Medical Officer, England - a post from which he retired in March 2022. Besides his career in medicine, 'Colonel JVT' was also an RAMC Reserve Officer from 1988-2000, serving as the Medical Officer to Lincolnshire Army Cadet Force. He is still exceptionally keen on mountain and fell walking and, as a qualified Joint Services Mountain Expedition Leader, led Cadet groups on numerous UK-based adventurous training activities, and some further afield in the French Alps during his time in uniform. He has also climbed Mt Kilimanjaro and Mt Fuji.

# GENERAL INFORMATION

■ **INTRODUCTION.** Welcome to Ten Tors 2023 and Okehampton Camp. The Ten Tors organisers endeavour to make Okehampton Camp as safe as possible. Please help us to achieve this by treating the camp and training area with care and have due consideration for others as well as yourselves.

■ **ROAD SAFETY.** Drivers are to follow the one-way circuit and comply with the speed limit of 15 mph. Please obey instructions given by parking marshals.

■ **PARKING.** Please ensure you park your vehicle in the correct car park.

■ **FIRE.** In the event of a fire, please take the following action:

1. **Muster Area. On the main square.**
2. **Action on outbreak of fire:**
  - a. **Raise the alarm by shouting FIRE, FIRE, FIRE**
  - b. **Attempt to restrict the fire to immediate area if safe to do so.**
  - c. **Call 01837 657186 and 999 and muster at your designated area.**

■ **FIRE PREVENTION.** To help prevent the outbreak of fire, smoking is not permitted in any building or tent.

■ **HELICOPTERS.** Helicopters will be operating in and out of the field between Okehampton Camp and Anthony Stile (TTC start/finish). This field is out of bounds to visitors for safety reasons at all times. When landing or taking off, helicopters create considerable downwash and noise. Please be aware of this to avoid any possible accident or injury.

■ **WASTE AND LITTER.** There will be general waste bins placed throughout Okehampton Camp. All the recycling waste will be removed by the waste company in their depot. You are asked to pick up any litter you might see and dispose of it correctly. Every little helps!

■ **TOILETS.** Portaloos are distributed across Okehampton Camp. Toilets can also be found in the TriBar.

■ **DOGS.** Dogs are permitted in the publicly accessible areas of Camp and on the Moor but not in the campsites. Please keep your dog on a lead or under control at all times and clear up any dog mess and place it in waste skips. Dogs are not permitted to stay overnight in cars or in the camp site.

■ **DRONES.** The unauthorised use of drones is forbidden inside Dartmoor National Park, particularly during Ten Tors when they may cause a serious hazard to aircraft.

**If you have any concerns or queries, please alert one of our stewards who are identifiable by their yellow fluorescent tabards.**

## TEN TORS CHALLENGE

■ The Ten Tors Challenge is open to 400 teams each of 6 teenagers. Teams spend 2 days on the moor attempting routes of 35, 45 or 55 miles depending on their ages. Teams are allocated one of 32 routes which they must then follow: routes only specify which staffed locations must be visited and in what order – it is up to teams to identify and navigate their own ways between them.

Service personnel run the 29 staffed locations which may be either Check Points or Safety Controls. The former are lightly staffed whilst the latter are larger, contain medical facilities and are sited to enable easy vehicle access in the event of emergency. In addition, all teams carry a satellite tracker which also allows them to summon assistance in case of emergency.

Teams start at 0700 hrs on the Saturday and can go no further than their 8th Tor on the 1st day. Teams on a 35 mile route must then camp at a staffed location whilst those on 45 or 55 mile routes choose their own sites. On the Sunday teams will not be checked in or out of a staffed location before 0600 hrs and then must make their way back to the finish point by 1700 hrs.

**35 mile route** 14-15 years

**45 mile route** 16-17 years

**55 mile route** 18-19 years



## JUBILEE CHALLENGE

■ The Jubilee Challenge is a one day expedition on Northern Dartmoor designed for young people with a range of physical, mental or educational challenges.

Up to 400 participants enter the Challenge each year, either as individuals or teams. There are 5 different routes available and Team Managers choose which one is best suited to an individual's specific capabilities, age and experience.

This year we are again piloting a new challenge called the Jubilee Challenge Plus which is an overnight event, and if successful will be made available for all establishments in 2024.

The Challenge is primarily run by the members of Exeter University Officer Training Corps (Army Reservists who are members of either Exeter or Plymouth Universities) who staff checkpoints and escort participants.

The Jubilee Challenge begins on the Saturday at 0730 hrs at a start point near the Okehampton Moorgate. The course closes at 1700 hrs on the same day.

**Route 1 - 7.5 miles**  
(rough going metalled roads suitable for wheelchairs)

**Route 2 - 8.5 mile** (cross country route)

**Route 3 - 12.5 miles**  
(cross country route)

**Route 4 - 15 miles** (cross country route)

**Jubilee Challenge Plus – 18 miles** with overnight camp






# Okehampton Camp Map




# Jubilee Challenge 2023

## Route 1 - 7.8 miles







# 1<sup>st</sup> FEMALE TEAM TO ENTER TEN TORS IN 1964

It is always satisfying and exciting to see the young practising for another Ten Tors. Living in Totnes the activity is always there, with the training evident through the Winter and Spring months.

**I**n 1964 Lieutenant Colonel Holifield was the Commanding Officer of the Denbury Junior Leaders Regiment. His daughter, Ms Chris Holifield, attended St Helen's School in Northwood Middlesex school with me. He thought that it was about time that girls should attempt the Ten Tors, so we were the guinea pigs!!

As we were at boarding school, we saw it as an escape, especially at weekends, where we planned our training carefully, so it always ended up at a day girl's house for tea! The map reading was taken seriously when we realised that if we didn't look after our feet as advised painful blisters would appear. They did! We could not let Colonel Holifield down!

We arrived in Newton Abbot met by Colonel Holifield who hoped we were taking this seriously. Six 16-year-old girls are not the easiest to control. Not like Junior Leaders!!

The next day we were taken to Denbury Camp and reality stepped in. At the time they thought it prudent for us to just do 25 miles to see if we would survive. Memory after all these years is faint but certain aspects remain. The weight of the rucksacks, map reading, army compasses, the humour of the NCOs thinking we were lightweight, dealing with blisters, the prison Leat and bogs, wet feet, cold at night, keeping morale up and using sense of humour and the excitement of achievement on completing Ten Tors.

I still have my medal! I'm so glad that 50 years on Ten Tors is still part of growing up and the importance of recognising the future leaders.

# MARK BESSELL



Mark Bessell: 19.03.74 - 30.12.22

**M**ark joined Ashton Park School in Bristol in 2009 as an Outdoor Educator and quickly transformed the provision for students outside the classroom. There were successful expeditions to Kenya and Tanzania, which included climbing Mount Kilimanjaro, as well as adventures closer to home.

In 2013 he launched Ten Tors as an opportunity for students to complete the following May. Training started that November on the nearby Mendips, and in December students were introduced to Dartmoor and the challenges of its landscape and climate.

In the years that followed, demand for Ten Tors has always exceeded the teams that have been allocated, as students have relished the opportunity to push their limits both mentally and physically. Mark has always been uncompromising in his expectations of students and the training that they must complete to secure their place on the team.

The success of Ten Tors in school provided momentum for Mark to further develop the school's extra-curricular provision, which included an adventurous activities club, overseas expeditions, a Forest School, and The Duke of Edinburgh's Awards.

Mark's mission to push people out of their comfort zone extended beyond the students to the wider school community, whether that was securing the volunteers to support the aforementioned activities, or organising staff activities, such as mountain biking, hiking, climbing, abseiling, snowboarding, and diving, in locations around the world.

In December, Mark was enjoying his customary winter climbing break with friends when he died in an avalanche on Ben Nevis. The number of attendees at his funeral was testament to the impact he had on both the school and local outdoor communities, as well as friends and family.

The tenacity displayed by students in wanting to complete this year's Ten Tors challenge, in order to 'honour Mr Bessell', demonstrates the resilience of all the students that tread the hills of Dartmoor. A tribute that reflects the passion and commitment shown by their Team Manager, and also the legacy of an event that can be transformative for so many of the young people that participate.



# DARTMOOR SEARCH & RESCUE GROUP

The Dartmoor Search and Rescue Group have been supporting Ten Tors, officially, since 1975. They are based throughout the South-west located at Ashburton, Okehampton, Plymouth and Tavistock.

**I**n total there are approximately 175 operational members, throughout the four teams, each of them bringing their own attributes that help create the highly professional organisation that is Dartmoor Rescue Group.

Trainees undergo a period of 12-18 months training, after an initial probationary period. If they complete their training successfully, they become full members. Trainee selection days take place once a year where they will be tested on their basic navigation skills to see if they can meet the entry requirements to be a team member, as well as taking part in a small written test.

The team works with the Police, Ambulance Service, Fire Brigade, Devon 4x4, and HM Coastguard.

This allows access to helicopters, more 4x4 vehicles, dive teams, etc.

When the weather is good, it can be possible to evacuate injured persons by helicopter or use heat seeking cameras on helicopters to help find missing persons. The weather on Dartmoor can make using helicopters very difficult, as well as even being unsafe. As a result the only solution is to use Search and Rescue Members and Search Dogs.
